# International students: France welcomes you

Despite travel restrictions due to the coronavirus pandemic, France has done everything to let you join your institution safely, whatever your country of origin. Whether you are a student in long-term or short-term studies, a student in an internship or a researcher, you are welcome to France. ## How can I come to France?

Depending on your country of origin,  
the steps to follow are different.

### Countries in the green zone \*

No specific  
access restriction to the  
territory ; an attestation of  
the absence of symptoms of  
Covid-19 and of contact in  
the fourteen days preceding  
the flight with a confirmed  
case may be requested.

### Countries in the red zone \*

Borders are closed, except  
for specific types of  
travellers, including  
students and researchers,  
who must carry an  
exempted movement  
certificate and a "contact"  
sheet indicating their  
residence address in France  
and an attestation of the  
absence of symptoms or  
contact with an infected  
person.

**You must follow specific  
steps depending on your  
country of origin.**

**BAHRAIN, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES, UNITED STATES, PANAMA,  
SOUTH AFRICA, ALGERIA, CHINA, ECUADOR, IRAQ, IRAN, ISRAEL,  
LEBANON, MOROCCO, DRC, TURKEY, RUSSIA, UKRAINE, ZIMBABWE**

Countries from which students and researchers must show before boarding a  
**negative PCR test from under 72 hours**. Otherwise, it will be possible to carry  
out a test on arrival in France, at the airport. In the event of a positive result,  
isolation for 7 days may be imposed.

### ALL OTHER COUNTRIES

Countries from which students and researchers must  
**carry out a test upon arrival in France, at the airport**.  
In the event of a positive result, isolation for 7 day may be imposed.

\*\* Special provisions are planned for the Overseas Territories.
